INTRODUCTION:

The rolling waves, glassy or frosty ice we see on the ocean's surface hide an amazing variety of underwater worlds – from sunlit coral reefs to dark abyssal canyons, from forests of giant kelp to mussel communities clustered around scorching hydrothermal vents, from tidal mangroves to the vast open ocean. Vast amount of DG are transported by sea. A global standard for classifying, packing and stowage is contained in the International Maritime Dangerous Goods Code (IMDG) and International Air Transportation Associations (IATA) of which cargo moves by air. As an importer and exporter, our responsibilities are to ensure all DG materials will be attained safely at all time.

Key Points that this Program will focus on:

- More and more organizations are involved in dangerous or hazardous materials in their manufacturing flows.
- All dangerous goods which are used in manufacturing especially imported materials have to undergo severe international standard in order to be protected from environmental contamination.
- Such activities have been established by the United Nation and being used internationally.
- As a manufacturer, the procedures of importing and handling of dangerous goods are critically important and this program has been designed to expose participants of international requirement and the implementation.

- The organization shall follow accordingly in order to avoid catastrophic situation which involves environment.
- Participants will also be exposed to the understanding of chemical safety and reaction in organization.

- Class 1 of Explosives.
- Class 2 of Gases.
- Class 3 of Flammable Liquids.
- Class 4 of Flammable solids.
- Class 5 of Oxidizing Substances.
- Class 6 of Toxic and Infectious Substances.
- Class 7 of Radioactive Materials.
- Class 8 of Corrosives and
- Class 9 of Miscellaneous Articles.

MODULE 3: Packing Groups of IATA Dangerous Goods in relation to the degree and kind of danger

- Packing Group 1 for goods presenting great danger.
- Packing Group 11 for goods presenting medium danger.
- Packing Group 111 for goods presenting minor danger.
- Instructions for the packing of cargo in freight containers.
- The correct usage of labels and placards, marking and packaging from inner, outer to overpack

MODULE 4: Packing Groups of IATA Dangerous Goods in relation to the degree and kind of danger

- The role and responsibilities of Freight Forwarder, Shipping Agent, Shipper and Manufacturer.
- The role and responsibilities of Ship's master, Principal Shipping Agent and Port Operators

MODULE 5: Dangerous Goods Transport Documentation Requirement and the Shipper's Declaration Form

- The importance of relevant information on Shipper, Consignee and Description of Goods in sequence.
- The importance of supplement information on Proper Shipping Name and Total or Limited Quantities

- Practical exercise on the steps to identify, classify and reference to applicability of DG Packing procedures
- Group assignment on avoidance of mis-handling and mis-use of DG guidelines. Ignorance of potential hazards and consequence impact.
